Fotograf 1. – 31. 10. Festival 2014 **#4** SEEING IS BELIEVING <u>EN</u> Photography is often a spirit snatcher

The Fotograf Festival opens in October with a series of performances, gallery openings and an international discussion forum at which we'll discover what is hidden in photographs that isn't always visible at first glance.

Prague, September 30th, 2014 – The theme of the 4th annual Fotograf Festival is *"Seeing Is Believing"*. The festival aims to raise questions connected with the trustworthiness of the photographic medium, and how much importance we are willing to attach to *"technical images"* despite the fact that they are as easily manipulated as any other pictures. The festival's official opening will take place on Friday, October 3 at the Veletržní Palace. The entire day will be packed full of events: an international discussion panel will take place in the afternoon; the evening features the official festival opening in the Small Hall, plus several performances, a *Fotograf* magazine release party, and an after-party at Café Jedna.

The festival opens several exhibitions in early October, including a show at Jelení Gallery entitled *Two Plus Two Makes Five* by **Tereza Zelenková**, a young Czech artist living in London. Also opening will be an exhibition by **Richard Loskot and Marek Štim** at etc. gallery, plus an exhibition by students from **FAMU** in the school building on the Smetana Embankment.

SPZ Gallery will host the opening of American multimedia and experimental artist **Sam Ashley's** unique project *Of the Essence (1984–2014)*, in which we will be the first to see his photographs from the Amazon region, developed after thirty years. Canadian artist **David Miller** will show disappearing images at Školská 28 under the title *Sol's Light*, and Kvalitář Gallery will host the opening of *(Re)framed,* a collaborative project by **Petr Dub, Marek Habr and Zdeněk Porcal**.

The following week, we can look forward to *Imaging* by **Aňa Šebelková** as part of Projektplus at the Holešovice train station; the Native American exhibition *Hin Mah Too Yah Lat Kekt* by **Aleksandra Vajd, Hynek Alt** and their guests at AMU Gallery; and an opening reception for *The Souls of Things*, an exhibition of works by **Emila Medková** and **Pavel Nešleha** at the Archive of Fine Arts at DOX.

Throughout the entire festival, passersby will be able to check out four display windows at the Veletržní Palace featuring **Peeping Cinephile** – a presentation of selected short films from the National Film Archive: *The Life of a Dead Frog*

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(1911), Electricity in Medicine (1943), Seconds Immortalized (1945), and Wanted: Toxin X (1962).

International and local guests will take part in a **discussion forum** entitled *"The Mirror Stage"* on October 3. Honored guests, who will debate this year's festival topic within the context of visual art, include **Margaret Iversen**, Professor of Art History at the University of Essex; **Karen Irvine**, curator at the Museum of Contemporary Photography in Chicago; **Katarzyna Majak**, curator of photography and university lecturer; art historian **Patrizia Munforte** from Universität Zürich; and **Václav Hájek**, visual culture theorist at Charles University in Prague.

In addition to other attractions, two multimedia interactive **performances** will take place at the Veletržní Palace on the day of the Fotograf Festival's official opening, one in the Small Hall (**Richard Loskot**: *Time Keeps It All Together*), and the other in the public space outside the building (**Jonáš Strouhal and Jonáš Rosůlek**: *Crippled by Consciousness*). A special 24th issue of *Fotograf* magazine has been published to accompany the festival; its release will be celebrated during the after-party at Café Jedna.

Among other festival events, we'd like to draw your attention to an impressive performance by **Boris Ondreička**, a famous Slovak artist who has transformed his lifelong interest in psychic photography into a night session called **Manifestation of the Spirit (mis-en-scène)**. The event will be premiered in the spectacular Baroque ballroom of the Colloredo-Mansfeld Palace.

As in the past, the festival is organized by the non-profit organization Fotograf 07, which also operates the Fotograf Gallery and has published *Fotograf* magazine in two language versions (Czech and English) since 2001.
